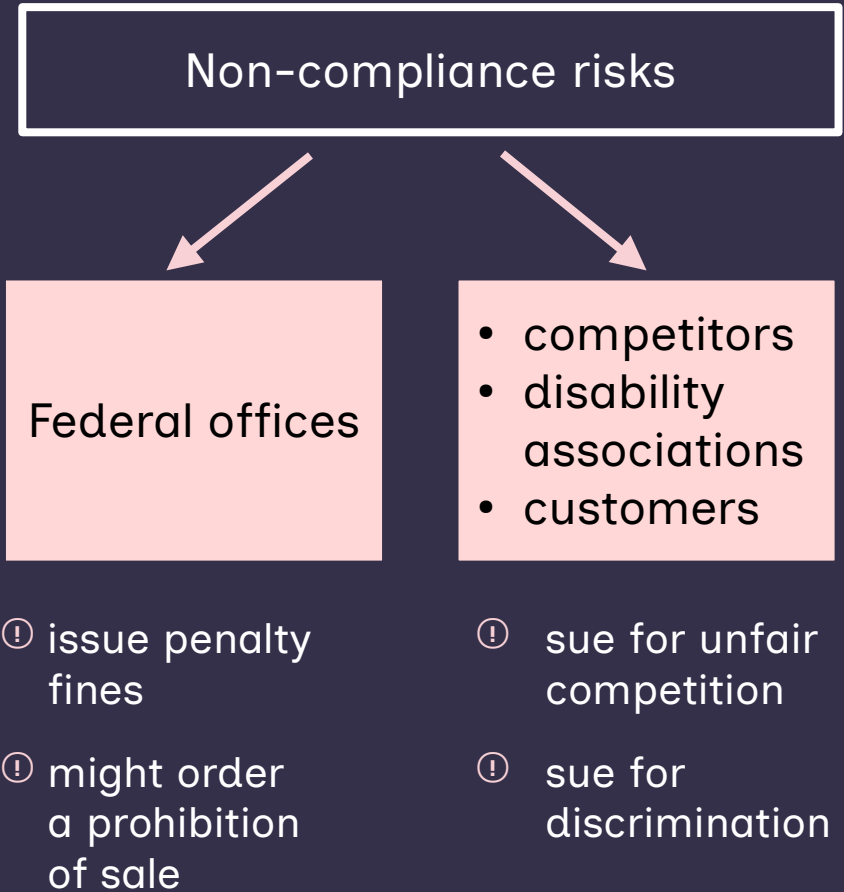

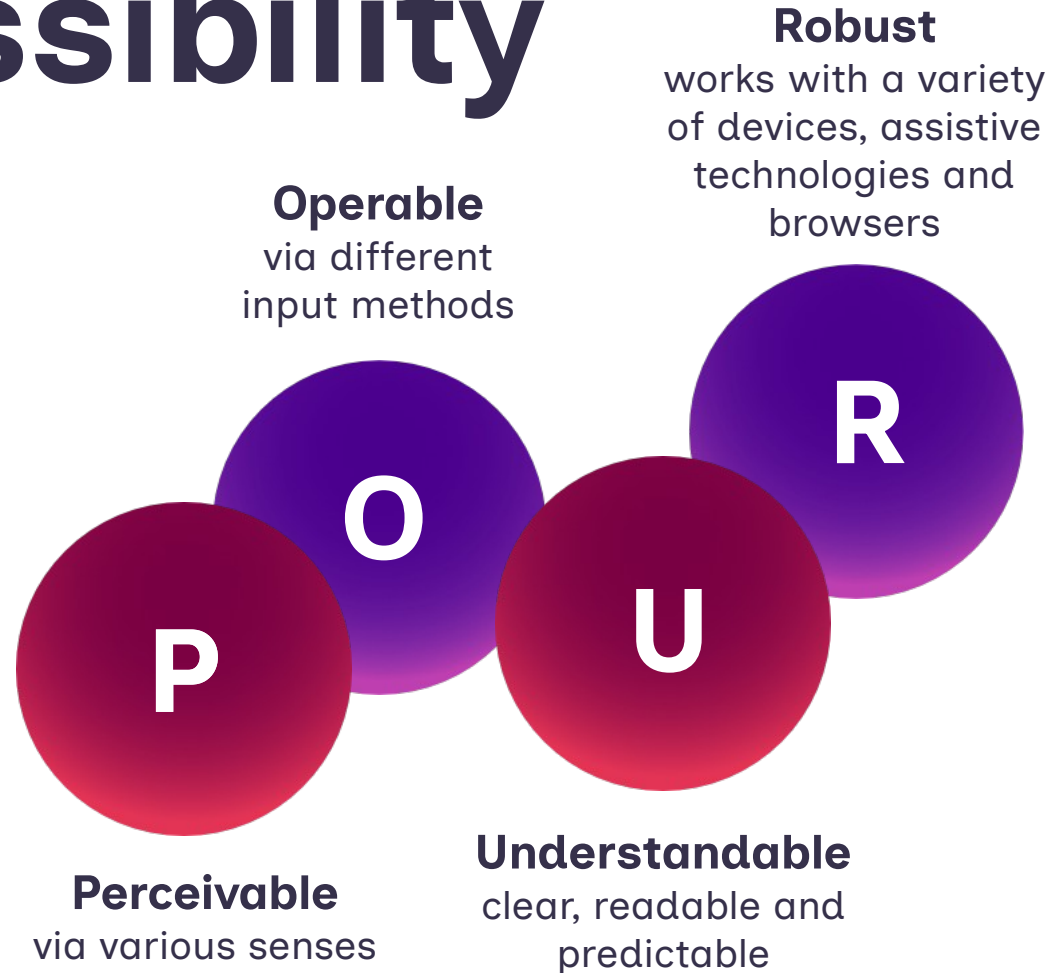

started

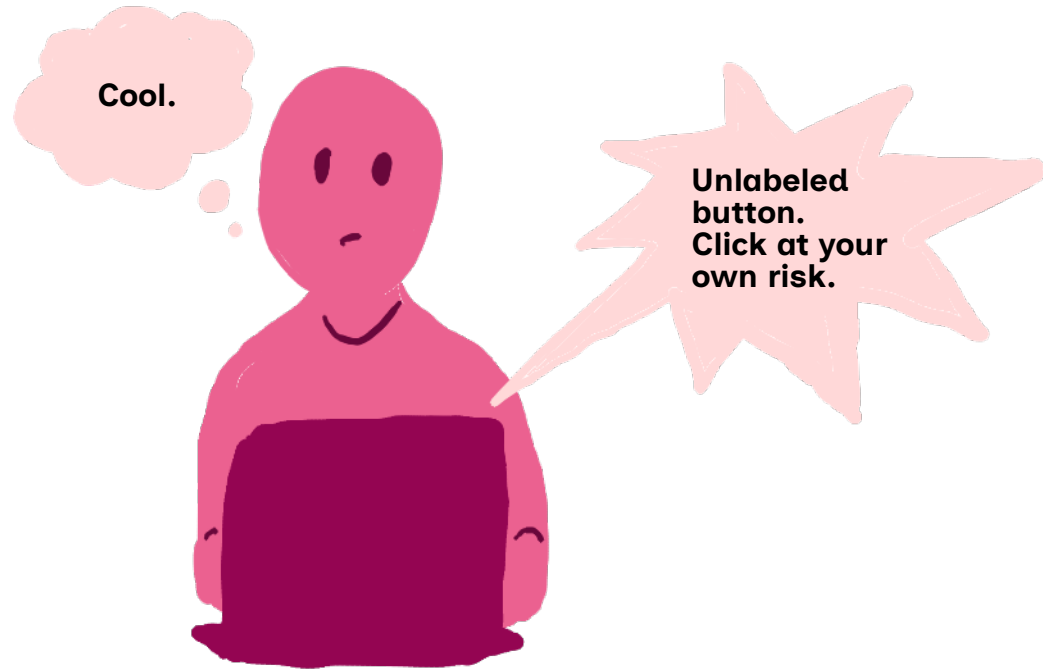

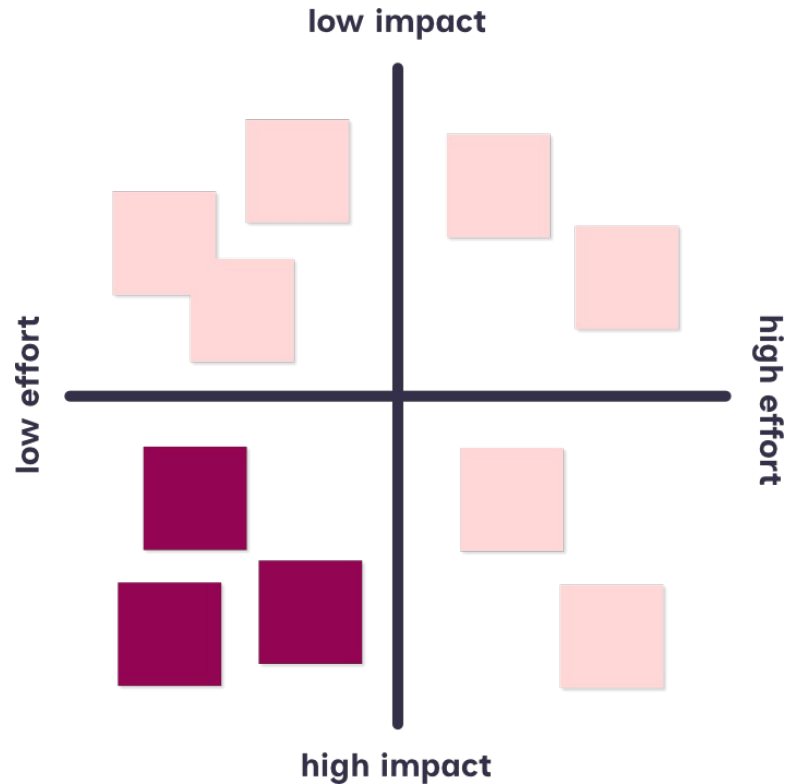

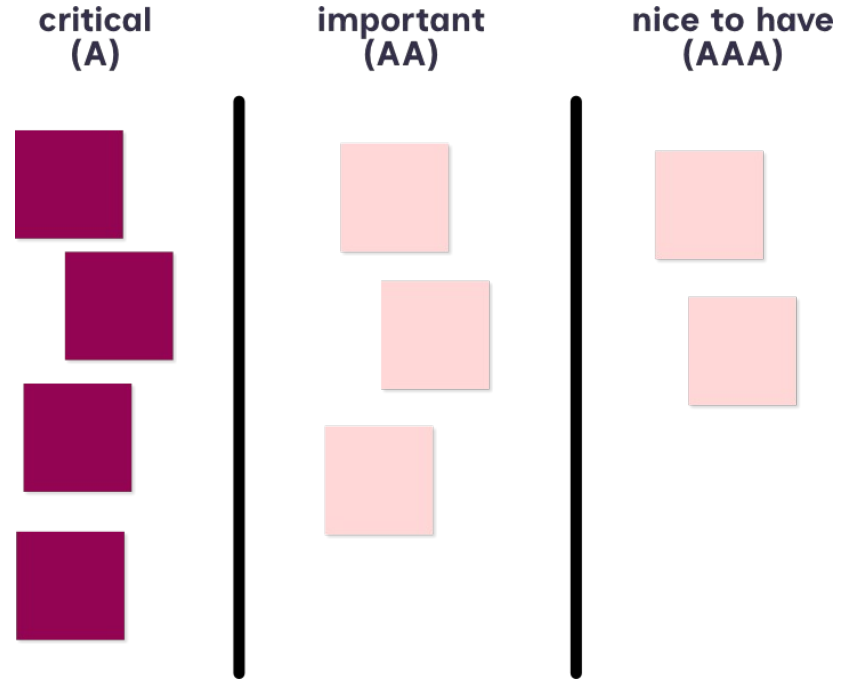
